The IAP designation is earned through passing the CIA Part 1 exam. It's ideal for students, beginner auditors, or rotational auditors seeking foundational knowledge of the IIA Standards The Institute of Internal Auditors+1. The new IAP requires around a 150-minute exam with 125 multiple-choice questions, and candidates have two years to complete it

Prerequisites

- No formal educational requirement specified; open to students, new auditors, and professionals without a degree

- General understanding of internal audit principles recommended.
- Upon completion, IAP provides a waiver for CIA Part 1 and is valid for three years; two years allowed to sit exam <a href="https://doi.org/10.1007/jheart1
