"Koeing" is attracted by the growth



Economic growth in Angola, located at 8.47 in 2012 and 5.6 in 2013, although slow and affected by the global financial crisis, is to attract foreign investment, said the vice president of Koeing, Friday in Luanda.

Sandeep Dhawan said in a press conference that growth and economic forecasts for the coming years Angola has excited foreign companies like yours to install their services in the country and expand the potential for skills development.

"Geographical position Angola, the pace of population growth, the commitment to universal education, the institutional effort to develop the local economy and advances in ICT are among the factors that underpin this optimistic scenario," he said. Sandeep Dhawan, which ended on Friday a visit of eight days Angola, said his company intends to contribute to the development of the local ICT market through partnerships with Angolan companies with which it works. From her perspective, this partnership will allow increasing the number of consultants with knowledge and technological skills trained, certificates and able to contribute to the sustainable development of Angola's human capital. At present it is already working with state and private companies, as Sonangol, the National Bank of Angola, Bank Credit and Savings, ENSA, Angola LNG, Chevron and Sistec in contracts which are having good results.

Last year, agreements with domestic companies allowed the formation of more than 500 Angolans in the ICT sector and the outlook this year is to triple the number. "Institutional companies we work with have stated to us that they wish to receive any more support in the computer industry, which is our corporate purpose, to increase the powers of Angolans," he added. Sandeep Dhawan said take good proposals for your company, how to make the training of technicians in Angola, instead of sending them to Dubai or India. "This will reduce the costs of training and deployment, because Angolans are preparing other frames in the country without any cost," he said.
